City of Fennville's Operations after Governor's Executive Order No. 2020-21

March 23, 2020

The Governor issued Executive Order No. 2020-21 on Monday, March 23, 2020 calling for the temporary requirement to suspend activities that are not necessary to sustain or protect life. The City of Fennville provides many essential functions and wants to ensure our citizens that we will continue to provide those services. We are also, however, being mindful of the order and conscience of the health and safety of our employees and community members. As a result, the City will be operating on limited capacity over the coming weeks.

Essential Functions

The City of Fennville operations are deemed essential functions by the Governor. City Staff will be reporting to work each day to perform necessary functions to maintain our Water and Sewer Systems. Further, the City will continue daily maintenance and trash service at Leland Memorial Paradise Park as we are all encouraged to seek opportunities for outdoor activities.

The City of Fennville Police Department continues to serve the community and the City Commission has authorized additional shifts during the coming weeks. If members of the community are shut in for any reason, and need supplies delivered or any other assistance, our officers are available to help. The City of Fennville City Offices will be closed to the public during this time and are encouraging all customers to communicate by phone and email. Should in-person assistance be required, it will be on an appointment only basis. Appointments can be requested by phone or email as stated below.
